Expectations of members of the Champion Theatre Production Class

As a member of the Champion Theatre Production class, you are expected to follow these simple guidelines:

1. You are to LEAD the department (not boss, not be arrogant or snobbish). Theatre I, Tech I and freshmen students will be watching you and will look up to you. SET THE EXAMPLE OF EXCELLENCE.
2. You are to be a member of the Thespian Society and support its endeavors since it is the department honor society. In other words, you are expected to attend and help with Thespian Society events such as Lock-in, Christmas Party, Haunted Theatre, Trick-or-Treat So Kids Can Eat, Talent Show, etc.
3. UIL One Act’s success is dependent on the entire department. Whether you are in the one act cast and crew or not, you will attend performances and competitions and help where asked and needed.
4. Complaining about a role, given or not given, only means you do not belong in this activity.
5. If you have a difference of opinion with your director, speak to him in private.
6. If you have a difference of opinion with a fellow actor or technician, speak to him/her about it. Do NOT talk about him/her to other members of the department behind his/her back. GOSSIP WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!
7. NEVER be late to a rehearsal.
8. NEVER miss a rehearsal.
9. If there is an emergency that prevents you from making it to rehearsal or performance, CALL! The office number is 357-2735; Avi’s Cell: (830) 481-7722
10. NEVER fail to turn in a class assignment in a theatre class (or other classes either). This will jeopardize your chances to be in a role in Main Stage productions and could result in removal from the class.
11. A cast party without the permission of the director is prohibited!
12. Your body is your instrument. Get used to regular exercise, vocal health, and a healthy diet. **Water is your drink of choice.** Coffee is permitted in moderation. Sodas, excessive sugary drinks are not recommended.
13. DO NOT pierce, tattoo, dye, or cut your hair (any body part, for that matter) without Avi’s approval first. You may just take yourself out of a role by doing so.
14. You are responsible for your rehearsal clothes (“BLACKS”) and shoes. Keep them clean and in good condition. COME TO REHEARSAL PREPARED!!!
15. NEVER STEAL!!! PERIOD.
16. The Classrooms and Black Box may begin to seem like a second home. Which means: YOU are responsible for their cleanliness and orderly upkeep!The stage area, tech area, audience area, and building in general should be sacrosanct to you and thus, it is your responsibility to police the area.
17. You are NOT an actor or technician without discipline, responsibility and organization.
18. Kindness, engagement, and respect at home and to your family is required to be a fully functioning adult.
19. Spiritual strength is one of the foundations of a good and worthy life. Theatre is a reflection of life. Therefore, if your spiritual strength is weak, so, too, will be your theatre.
20. This program is a privilege to belong to, NOT a right.
21. Lunch Bunch, Breakfast Club and After School Social Hour is a privilege, NOT a right. At any time, Avi may revoke your privileges if the place is not left clean or if you are causing a disturbance.
22. Borrowed books/plays from Avi’s library MUST BE RETURNED and, if lost or damaged, paid for replacement.
